Private Pilot Ground School: **REQUIREMENTS**

Ground School → 40 hours of flight time → FAA Licensure Test



Pilot Training @ GovState

Private Pilot Ground School: **CONTENT**

Log 40 total hours	20 from an instructor including	3 hours of cross-country training
3 hours of simulated instrument	3 hours in the last 2 months before the practical exam	3 hours of night training including
Cross country over 100 NM	10 stop and go's with a full lap in the traffic pattern each at night	10 hours of solo time including
5 hours of solo cross-country time	1 flight of 150 NM total distance, with full-stop landings at three points, and one segment of the flight consisting of a straight-line distance of more than 50 nautical miles between the takeoff and landing locations	3 stop and go's with a full lap in the traffic pattern at an airport with an operating control tower.

250 hours of flight time → FAA Licensure Commercial Pilot



Commercial License: Single Engine

Commercial License: **CONTENT - 250 hours**

100 hours in powered aircraft	50 hours in airplanes	10 hours solo or 10 hours of flight time performing the duties of pilot in command with an authorized instructor.
100 hours of pilot-in-command flight time, which includes at least	Ten hours of instrument training	10 hours of training in a complex airplane, a turbine-powered airplane, or a technically advanced airplane
One 2-hour cross country flight during the day	One 2-hour cross country at night	3 hours with an instructor in the last 2 months before the practical test

Medical Clearance

- Physical, meet medical standards for cardiovascular and neurological health.
- 20/20 Vision or eyesight corrected to 20/20 vision with corrective lenses.
- Cannot be color blind.
- Hearing, must be able to hear an average conversation from 6 feet away.
- Ask about waivers.

Certified Flight Instructor: \$1,536 – 45 hours	Minimum Hours: n/a

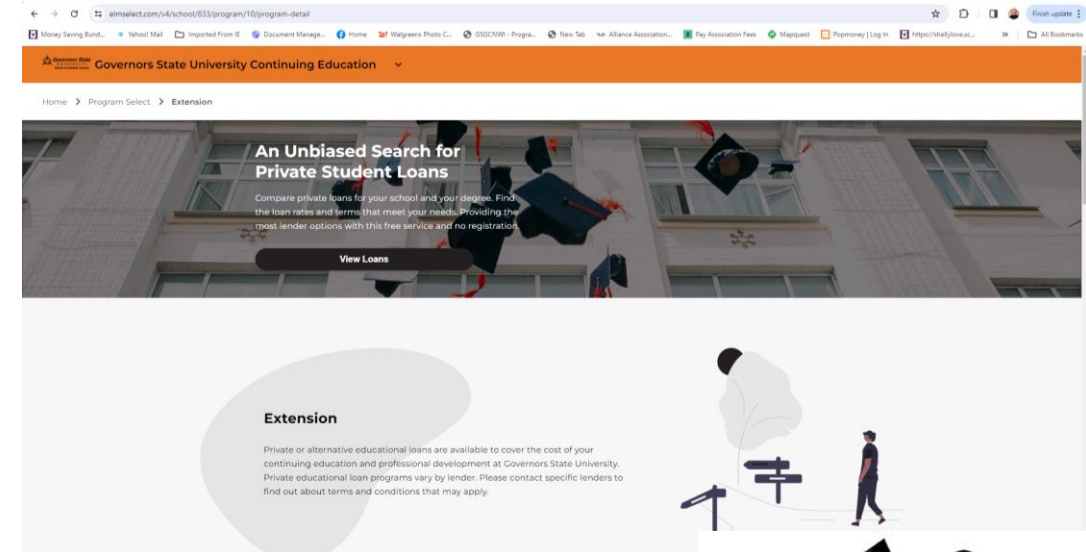
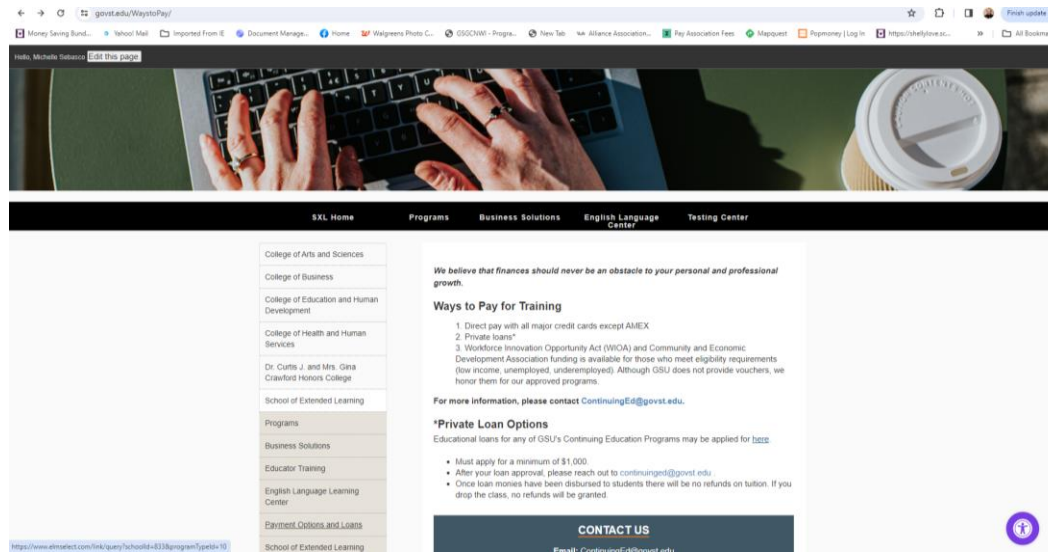
