Register for any one of the available CPR for Teens summer camp sessions and gain skills that could save someone's life.

The Basic Life Support (BLS) CPR course teaches essential life-saving skills used in medical emergencies. Participants will learn how to recognize cardiac arrest, perform CPR, use an Automated External Defibrillator (AED), and provide care for choking victims. The course includes hands-on practice and real-life scenarios to help build confidence and quick response in emergency situations.

This training is ideal for anyone interested in learning how to save a life. Upon successful completion, participants will receive a BLS certification. Lunch is provided. Due to the large number of participants, we are unfortunately unable to accommodate individual food allergy or dietary requests. Participants with specific dietary needs may wish to bring their own food to ensure their requirements are met.
