The Florida Institute for Forensic Anthropology & Applied Science presents an advanced workshop for forensic anthropologists, law enforcement, crime scene investigators, death investigators, & medical examiners on how to locate and excavate complex burials. This is an advanced course with hands-on field training, including the excavation of single and multiple person burials & staged outdoor crime scenes using human cadavers from the USF Human Donation program located at the USF/IFAAS FORT (Facility for Outdoor Research & Training).

## Participants will learn:

- How to locate clandestine burials using remote sensing and forensic archaeology, such as ground penetrating radar, historic imaging, GIS mapping, drones.
- How to excavate buried bodies, using donated human cadavers for multiple individual burials & staged homicides.
- Best practices for documentation of complex outdoor scenes through traditional low budget methods (scene sketching) & technology driven methods (3D scanning and GIS methods).
- Innovative methods in forensic anthropology & applications for international human rights in genocide and war crimes investigations.
