September 22, Brenda Vogds Personalized Learning: A Journey Toward HyFlex, Learner-Centered Education

October 28, Brit Broshous Trauma Smart Training: Reaching and Teaching Through Trauma Smart Awareness

TraumaSmart was developed by the experts at Crittenton Children's Center and founded on evidence-based interventions recognized by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services and the National Child Traumatic Stress Network. While we can't protect students from going through a traumatic experience, we can help them cope and recover. Trauma Smart helps students, and the adults who educate them, calmly navigate difficult life challenges by combining practical, hands-on tools and effective coping strategies. By incorporating Trauma Smart into your curriculum and instruction, you will be laying the groundwork for better emotional resilience and health for our students and, inevitably, our society.

February 4, Brian Mendler Motivating and Managing Hard to Reach, Disruptive, and Uninterested Students

Plagued by severe undiagnosed ADHD and reading difficulties, Brian began disrupting class in 4th grade. He was defiant, disruptive, and relatively unmotivated. By sixth grade his academic skills were so below grade level that he was pulled / kicked out of school. During his senior year, he started gambling. The next five years were a cycle of lying, cheating and stealing to feed his addiction. In 2001 he entered recovery. He has now been clean 18 years. Today he is a certified teacher, presenter, and international keynote speaker. He has coauthored six books, including the bestseller, That One Kid, Tips for Teachers, Power Struggles, Turning Tough Parents into Strong Partners, and the newest book, Watch Your Mouth.



March 2, Tara Martin #BookSnaps: Learning Disguised as Fun!

During this interactive workshop, participants will actively explore the science, creation, and impact of #BookSnaps. Let's speak the students' language using Snapchat to share excerpts of a book while annotating with #BookSnaps.
