Woodland Wildscaping

Flowers: The list below is offered as a general guideline. You are the designer... add or substitute as you wish.

Container: There is no limit in choice of container. Use everything & any object as long as it holds water with an opening between 4" to 6" wide. I will be using a 4" wide, brass pedestal container. Baskets, wooden and ceramic containers along with watering cans are as just a few options. Check out trishosullivanandesign.com for great ideas in repurposed containers.

The trick of great design is a smaller container opening, personally I use 3" - 4"

Floral Materials:

5 to 10 stems Spider Mums or Pin Cushion Proteas or Dahlias

5 to 10 stems small Button Poms Poms

3 to 5 stems small green Hydrangeas,

5 to 10 stems Green Trick (green dianthus)

1 bunch of flat leaf Eucalyptus with berries

5 to 10 stems green or orange Hypericum

5 to 10 stems Bupleurum

5 stems Curly Willow

Optional:

Vines, bark, ferns, pods, dried flowers or any botanical material that you envision as
“Wild”

Design tools:

Please fill-up container $\frac{3}{4}$ with cool water

1 roll of clear $\frac{1}{2}$ ” florist tape or any strong scotch tape

Floral clippers, knife and scissor

3 to 9 water tubs

10 long wooden skewers

Cotton rag or paper towel
