SUPPLY LIST

- Graphite Pencils: One each of 4H, 2H, HB, 2B, 4B, 6B. 2H or 3H with rounded tip (more on this in class). Suggested brands: Wooden pencils - Faber-Castell 9000* (top all around), Staedtler Mars Lumograph, Mitsubishi Hi-Uni* (lovely dark B pencils), or Kita-Boshi, and/or Blackwing for soft leads (smooth but expensive) The hardness ratings may vary from brand to brand.

Or... Clutch type 2 mm. lead holder* with leads in 2H and HB Great for precision marks without sharpening frequently. *Staedtler Mars* makes a nice heavy pencil.

- Pencil sharpener and sandpaper: Sandpaper block, emery board, or fine sanding sheet for keeping a fine point in between sharpening. If using a mechanical drafting pencil with changeable leads, you will need a pencil pointer. *KUM** makes a long length 2 step handheld sharpener for wooden pencils.

- **Erasers:** Bostik's Blue-Tack* putty can be shaped (or use a kneaded eraser), white plastic eraser (the pencil shaped Tombow Mono plastic erasers are nice for getting into small areas). The Vanish* or Sakura foam* erasers are good overall and may be cut into smaller sizes.

- Soft Brush – For cleaning off eraser bits, soft cosmetic brush works well.

- Paper: Stillman and Birn Zeta* series (sold in sheet or sketchbooks), Arches*, or Stonehenge* 140lb.hot pressed watercolor paper. Or a medium/heavy weight drawing paper such as Canson and Strathmore (300 or 400 series) has slight tooth so not as good for details. Tracing or copier paper for sketching.

- Removable tape: Drafting, painters, washi, or Artists tape.

- Small desk lamp: Gooseneck or swing lamp to light subject using a single LED or incandescent bulb.

- Paper towels or cloth rag

- Plant specimens: You will use your own plant material, more on this will be sent out before class meets

Optional

- Electric eraser: Derwent, Sakura, Ohuhu* or other battery and rechargeable options.

- Mechanical Pencil: HB 0.3 mm. or Pentel Orenz 0.2 mm.*Note that smaller leads break and clog the pencil easily but create beautiful consistent lines.

- Grey scale and value finder: Found in fine art stores
