- Perylene Maroon (W & N)
- French Ultramarine Blue (W & N)
- Burnt Sienna (M. Graham)
- Raw Sienna (M. Graham)
- Burnt Umber (M. Graham)

Watercolor Paper:

I use Arches 140 lb. Hot Press (cut into two 8.5" x 11" pieces if from a larger sheet). Please feel free to use the watercolor paper that you prefer.

You will need a smaller strip of the same paper for your color testing.

Watercolor Brushes:
