Winter Citrus

Flowers: The list below is offered as a general guideline. You are the designer... add or substitute as you wish.

Container: There is no limit in choice of container. Use everything & any object as long as it is holds water with an opening between 4" to 6" wide. I will be using a 4" wide pedestal container. Baskets, wooden and ceramic containers along with watering cans are as just a few options. Check out trishosullivandesign.com for great ideas in repurposed containers.

The trick of great design is a smaller container opening, personally I use 3"-4"

Floral Materials:

10 stems ranunculus

10 stems carnations

10 stems Queen's Ann's lace

3 to 5 stems hydrangeas,

3 to 5 small clementine oranges

3 to 5 kumquats

5 to 10 stems of flat leaf eucalyptus with berries

10 stems wax flower

5 to 10 stems bupleurum

Optional: Berries, pods or dried botanical material...any botanical material that you envision as "Winter"

Design tools:

Please fill-up container ¾ with cool water
1 roll of clear ½" florist tape or any strong scotch tape
10 long wooden skewers
Floral clippers, knife and scissor
3 to 9 water tubs
Cotton rag or paper towel
