-Course description

Abundance is accessible for anyone who is willing to pursue it. In the context of drawing, numerous models only require patience and dedication to develop skill and improve observation. This class will focus on chrysanthemums and will teach students how to approach this complex botanical subject. Students will learn to understand spatiality and address the geometry of the plant. They will use drawing both as an observational tool and as an expression method, progressing from free sketching to detailed tracing, resulting in an accurate depiction of one of autumn's notable botanical specimens.

Plant models: 3 Chrysanthemums, easier to draw is light color, like white or yellow
