Recommended information to assemble prior to class

...Though not mandatory, you'll get faster results by coming prepared!

- ✓ An editable (digital) copy of your resume
 - → I recommend Word instead of Google Docs if possible
- ✓ A headshot
 - → Tip: YouTube headshot tutorials to learn how to take one yourself
- ✓ Extract 1-3 top quotes from letters of recommendation or performance appraisals, one or two sentences long, that make you shine
 - → Tip: If you do not have any letters of recommendation to draw from, request them now from prior employer(s) or professor(s). You should aim to have 2-3 solid letters of recommendation in your portfolio.
- ✓ A list of 2-10 classes you've taken (in school or non-credit) that are relevant to the professional world/your target industry
 - → Note the institution/course provider + year completed for each course
- ✓ Pick 3-10 adjectives that best describe you from this list
- ✓ A list of conferences you've attended [+ year]
- ✓ A list of school/professional papers you've written + or presentations you've given (that sound interesting or relevant) [+ school/employer + year]
- ✓ A list of any community service or unpaid labor you've done whether formal (with an organization) or informal (helping family with unpaid summer jobs, babysitting, child/elder care, kids' school involvement...) [+ dates]
- ✓ A list of any awards from high school, sports, community service... [+ year]
- ✓ Describe in 1-2 sentences any experience you have with mentoring—formal and informal. (Helped tutor classmates? Helped a new hire on day 1?)
